Zebra



This zebra is very easy to make, as all parts are made in garter stitch

- Cast on 28 stitches in WHITE and knit
- Rows 1-2 in WHITE
- Rows 3-4 in BLACK
- Rows 5-6 in WHITE
- Rows 7-8 in BLACK
- Rows 9-10 in WHITE
- Rows 11-12 in BLACK
- Rows 13-14 in WHITE
- Rows 15-16 in BLACK
- Rows 17-18 in WHITE
- Rows 19-20 in BLACK
- Rows 21-22 in WHITE
- Rows 23-24 in BLACK
- Rows 25-26 in WHITE
- Row 27 in BLACK
- Row 28: cast off 7 stitches, knit 14 stitches and cast off the remaining 7 stitches
- Rows 29-30 knit the remaining 14 stitches in WHITE. This is the zebra's neck
- Cast off

Head

- Cast on 11 stitches in BLACK and knit
- Rows 1-4 in BLACK
- Rows 5-6 in WHITE
- Rows 7-8 in BLACK
- Rows 9-12 in WHITE
- Row 13-14 in BLACK
- Row 15 in WHITE
- Cast off

Ears (make 2)

- Cast on 4 stitches in WHITE
- Rows 1-8 knit
- B&T
- Pull the thread so the top of the ear is pointed and secure with one or two stitches

Making up

- Fold the sides of the head together and close the snout (that is the black end) and the seam in the middle as shown in the picture
- Turn the head so the right side is out.
 This makes the snout a bit more rounded
- Sew up the head, filling it as you proceed



- Fold the base of each ear and secure with a few stitches
- Attach the ears tot the head
- Embroider the eyes in BLACK in the white band on the head
- Fold the main hat and close the back and the black half of the front of the hat
- Attach the head to the neck
- Make a bundle of 5 pieces of BLACK wool of 10 cm each, fold them in half and tie a knot in the middle. This is the zebra's tail. Attach the tail to the main hat
- Weave in all remaining threads
- The short manes can be made as follows: place a knitting needle on top of the zebra and use
 it to make loops around it, white loops in the white stripes and black loops in the black
 stipes. Three loops in each stripe is fine. Make loops on top of the neck and the head as well.
 Weave in the ends and take out the knitting needle. Alternatively, only make a few manes on
 top of the head
